GENERAL INFORMATION:

1. All wrestling competition will be held in Stabler Arena. Eight mats will be used for the competition on Friday. Stabler Arena does not provide adequate locker and shower facilities so it is strongly recommended that teams change and shower at their place of residence.
2. Each team will be allowed a participants pass for each “competing wrestler” that is listed on the entry form, plus up to four (4) additional passes if needed for: (2) Coaches, (1) Manager, (1) Trainer. The number of additional passes will be allocated proportional to the competing team size. No additional participant passes will be offered or sold beyond the number allotted.
3. Entry Fee will be \$70.00 per wrestling weight class entered and payable only after regional qualification confirmed on site or by the Region Rep.
4. Ticket Prices
 - a. Friday \$25.00
 - b. Saturday \$25.00
 - c. Two Day Ticket \$40.00
 - d. Children 5 and under are free
 - e. Ticket Prices include all appropriate taxes
5. Programs
 - a. \$5.00
 - b. Coaches of competing schools will have a Friday coupon and a Saturday coupon to redeem for a program.

LODGING INFORMATION:

All teams are expected to provide their own lodging and meals. Housing options are offered on the web page under the “Lodging Link”. You may use www.discoverlehighvalley.com for further options. Please advise all members of your team and their family of your hotel accommodations and the appropriate hotel phone number.

FOOD & BEVERAGE:

Schools, participants, and spectators are not permitted to bring food or beverages in Stabler Arena. Only fluids carried by individual participating wrestlers will be allowed into the contestant’s entrance. No glass containers or coolers are permitted. The Stabler Arena Concessions menu contains an array of foods available for purchase.

MEDICAL SERVICES INFORMATION:

1. Each school is responsible for the physical well being of its respective team members upon their arrival. However, the National Prep Medical Staff has the final jurisdiction over all injuries or accidents occurring during competition.
2. All wrestlers will have a thorough skin exam at registration. The Tournament Medical Staff will make final determinations.
3. The entry fee will not be refunded for medically disqualified participants.
4. Certified and licensed trainers will be permitted to be on the floor and issued wristbands appropriately with proof of proper credentials.

Medical Services at the National Prep Tournament will be provided by Coordinated Health. As an established orthopedic and sports medicine leader, Coordinated Health brings a high level of experience and expertise to this event. Athletic trainers will be available before, during and after the meet to care for injuries. The tournament will feature a designated Coordinated Health Athletic Training area for off-mat treatment with select modalities. To streamline the treatment processes, athletes may find it helpful to bring a note from their home school athletic trainer detailing the specifics of their injury and treatment needs. Such information is certainly not mandatory but may be helpful in expediting the athlete’s treatment sessions. OFFICIAL ENTRY INFORMATION:

1. Official potential entries should be registered via the web site no later than Friday, February 16, 2018 @ 4:00PM. Make sure all potential wrestlers are showing. Fill out all relevant information as to previous year placement and weight class. You will be asked to declare and pay for your expected entries by weight **after regional qualification**. Questions about special circumstances should be emailed for directions.
2. Only one wrestler can wrestle per weight class.
3. NO ENTRY FEE REFUNDS.
4. Positively no additions to team roster will be allowed after receipt of Official Entry Form.
5. A two- (2) lb. growth allowance as per National Federation guidelines. (Rule 4-4-4) The only other acceptable weight allowance is for consecutive days of competition.
6. Our acknowledgement of receipt of this form will include the listing of wrestlers on the web site.
7. ALL payments, whether by credit card or check must be received by 4:00pm on Wednesday, February 21, 2018. Credit card info will be entered via the web site; if not the entry will not be accepted. \$68.00 for each weight class entered. This process can take place after the regional qualification is confirmed.
8. If you must pay by check, make check payable to "Lehigh University" - please note 'National Prep' on check in addition to your school name and overnight it to:

9. On Thursday, February 22, registration will be held from 5:30pm to 7:30pm with skin check starting at 5:35pm in Stabler Arena. This year the registrations will be as per the registration schedule that appears on the web **site and page 1 of this document**. When a team comes in for its scheduled appearance they will go to skin check as a team. Please note that the doors to Stabler will not open until 5:30pm so please make your travel plans accordingly.
10. Weight Certification. We ask that you follow the National Prep Weight Certification Guidelines as to weight certification. This requires that you set a minimum weight class for each competitor and follow the other new rules of relevance. The means of setting that weight class may vary from region to region. You may be asked to provide documentation if challenged.
11. Note: Schools are expected to use the NWCA/Tanita Weight Management Program via www.nwcaonline.com. Those schools fully utilizing and properly recording their body fat, hydration and weight reduction and season weighins and results can use this as their method of certification.
12. Weigh-Ins. We are going to have the initial weigh-in starting at 7:30am Friday. You will have one chance to make weight other than immediately challenging on the other scales (Rule 4-5-1). There will be no opportunity to lose weight at Stabler. There will be a second weigh-in Saturday morning prior to the session. More information on this procedure will be made available as time progresses

TOURNAMENT RULES:

1. School Eligibility Statement- Any NAIS, other Independent, Private or Parochial school that does not attend any portion of its state's public association championship tournament series will be eligible for the National Prep School Championships. This applies to the school not individual wrestlers. If the school participates in their public state championship, all wrestlers from that school are ineligible for the National Prep Championships. See the web page for full eligibility info.
2. National High School Rules as set forth in the National Federation of State High School Associations Rule Book will govern: rules of wrestling and the age cutoff date is, if participant reaches his 19th birthday before August 1, 2018.
3. We will have two weigh-ins and we will follow the High School two (2) lb. growth allowance and with an additional one pound allowance for the second day.
4. Wrestlers certify for their weight class by either making scratch weight or scratch plus growth allowance one time before their regional qualifier.
5. It is recommended that coaches bring appropriate weigh-in documentation with them to the tournament.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES:

1. Preregistrations: Between February 9 and February 16 @ 4 pm all possible names/weights to be registered.
2. Most regional events will take place as late as the weekend of February 17-18. The lists of confirmed entries will be put on the web site by Monday, February 19 at 4pm.
3. Note: Payment should be made via credit card by filling out the appropriate info on the web registration form before 4:00pm Wednesday February 21 EST. If payment is by check, it must be overnighted so as to be received at Lehigh by Wednesday February 22 4pm.
4. Schools will be assigned to a registration time based on their region. This will then be used to generate an 'appointment' schedule to help expedite the weigh-in/registration process. Schools/Regions will be assigned to 15 min time frames based on past registration experience. The coach will register his team, checking for entry mistakes and then the whole team will go to the skin check/weigh in area as a unit.
5. Bring the signed Coach and ALL Wrestler Medical Attestation forms. Teams will not be permitted to Register without these completed forms.
6. Wrestlers being considered as questionable during the skin check will have to wait until the end of the process to be cleared/disqualified.
7. Teams showing up late for the process will be handled as soon as convenient.
8. Teams showing up early will not be processed before their scheduled times.

AWARDS:

Awards will be made to first 8 individual place winners in each weight. Team awards will be made to the top ten teams.

Billy Sheridan Trophy– winning team – undergraduate competitors

James B. Detrixhe Memorial Trophy– winning team has post graduate or 5th year students – team total must be higher than any team entered. (No award will be made if a PG/5th year team is not overall #1).

Bob Dalling Trophy – wrestler with most falls in the least aggregate time

Gerald Leeman Outstanding Wrestler – coaches choice

Neil Buckley Service Merit Award – coach that best exemplifies the dedication represented by Neil Buckley

Major Ray Mendoza Award- wrestler earning the most team points during the tournament.

IMPORTANT MEDICAL INFORMATION

As we look with anticipation to the annual **National Prep Tournament**, we thought it would be important to express our "Disposition of Skin Infections" to be conducted at registration. The Tournament dermatologist, will coordinate efforts toward skin examinations pertaining to any suspicious lesions. We will be using the National guidelines, which are utilized by the NCAA for Wrestling dual matches, tournaments, and Championships (see attachments).

As with each year there will be an on-site visual examination conducted. Microscopic exams will be done for highly questionable cases of ringworm and herpes simplex. The on-site examination and physician statement is conclusive and final.

The Tournament Medical Staff will not tolerate any coach or wrestler who purposely attempts to **"camouflage"** an area of a potentially infectious skin rash or skin eruption. There will be serious consequences, including disqualification of a wrestler and or coach, team penalty points or sanctions in the ensuing year.

The Medical Staff would also state that **"any skin eruption"** that cannot be definitively characterized (possibly due to application of a bleach product resulting in a open wound/chemical burn), and has not been properly evaluated by a knowledgeable physician or dermatologist "prior" to the tournament, will be considered potentially infectious and the wrestler will be disqualified.

It is then with the above statements that we strongly recommend a screening of your team by a knowledgeable physician previous to your arrival. Our advice would be to suggest such a screening, one week prior to the tournament. The **skin infection guidelines** should be reviewed by your attending physician in order to further **lessen the possibility** of a wrestler being disqualified. ***The decision of the on-site examination by the National Prep Medical Staff is final. We strongly suggest that coaches, athletic trainers and treating physicians contact us prior to the tournament with any real cases of concern, or any question regarding a recommended treatment at natpreps@natprepwestling.com.***

Please also have in hand written confirmation of treatment regimen regarding a specific skin infection. We feel strongly that these simple epidemiological principles will go a long way in preventing highly contagious skin diseases among wrestlers. These efforts should be made to ensure the safety of your wrestlers and viability of wrestling as a sport. We thank you for your cooperation and wish you a healthy and successful season.

Please confirm as the Coach you have clearly read and understood the written skin infection guidelines **by signing the "Coach Medical Attestation Form"**. Also, please have **each wrestler AND Parent (or legal guardian) sign the "Wrestler/Parent Medical Attestation Form"**. **All signed documents must be surrendered at Registration.**

- There will be a number of certified athletic trainers on site for the duration of the tournament. They will be centrally located on the floor and will handle any injuries that occur. *The athletic trainers will have the final decision regarding all medical disqualifications.*
- There will be no physician on site during competition, however, we will be using Coordinated Health as a referral source. An ambulance crew will be on site for the duration of the event.

FACILITIES:

* There will be an athletic training room/area provided for the use by all participating athletes. We will provide hot packs, injury ice, biohazard disposal, first aid supplies and minimal taping supplies. Please bring materials for any athletes needing taping. Modality treatments will be conducted by certified athletic trainers only.

EQUIPMENT/SERVICES:

- Skin Exams/Weigh-Ins: Skin examinations will be held in Stabler Arena on Registration Thursday. Weigh-Ins will be held Friday morning before competition. Water will be provided during weigh-ins. Please see attached letter regarding skin examination protocol.
- Water: Water stations will be set up on the four corners of the arena during the tournament.
- Injury Ice: Injury ice will be available in the athletic training room area at all times during the event. Ice supplies are limited, therefore ice is provided *only* for injury. Ice will not be provided for beverages. Emergency: An ambulance crew will be on hand and in radio communication with the medical staff for the duration of the event. The athletic training room will be supplied with directions/phone numbers for area hospitals. Orthopedic injuries needing further evaluation will be referred to either Coordinated Health Systems or the ER of St. Luke's. Participants are encouraged to bring proof of insurance with them to the tournament in the case of an injury. Lehigh University is *not* responsible for any costs incurred from an injury sustained during the tournament.
- Registration: Visiting Athletic Trainers are asked to come to the registration/weigh-in/skin exam session in order to receive their floor pass. The Head Tournament Athletic Trainer will be on-site to answer any questions regarding medical services coverage and to assist the visiting athletic trainers where possible. TOURNAMENT GUIDELINES FOR DISPOSITION OF SKIN INFECTIONS

Herpes Simplex

Primary Infection

1. Letter from team physician to include: clinical diagnosis, culture results (if done), verification of, and dates of systemic antiviral therapy .
2. Wrestler must be free of systemic symptoms of viral infection (fever, malaise, etc.).
3. Wrestler must have no new blisters for three days prior to the examination.
4. **Wrestler must be on appropriate dosage of systemic antiviral therapy for at least 5 days prior to and at the time of the tournament.**
5. **Active herpetic infections shall not be covered to allow participation. See above criteria when making decisions for participation status.**

Recurrent Infection

1. Letter from team physician to include: clinical diagnosis, verification of, and dates of systemic antiviral therapy.
2. Blisters must be completely dry and covered by a FIRM ADHERENT crust at time of tournament, or wrestler cannot participate.
3. **Wrestler must have been on appropriate dosage of systemic antiviral therapy for at least three days prior to and from the time of the tournament.**
4. Active herpetic infections shall be covered to allow participation. See above criteria when making decisions for participation status

Questionable Cases

1. Tzanck prep and/or HSV antigen assay (if available).
2. Wrestler's status deferred until Tzanck prep and/or HSV assay result complete.

Wrestlers with a history of recurrent herpes labialis or herpes gladiatorum should be considered for seasonal long prophylaxis with Zovirax (acyclovir) or Valtrex. This decision should be made after consultation with the wrestling team physician.

Bacterial Infections (Furuncles, Folliculitis, Impetigo)

1. Letter from team physician to include: Clinical diagnosis, culture results (if done) sensitivity results (if done), and dosages, dates and names of antibiotic therapy. (Cultures and sensitivities are strongly encouraged and to select proper antibiotic therapy).
2. Wrestler must have been without any new skin lesions for 48 hours prior to the tournament
3. Wrestler must have completed a minimum of 5 days of antibiotic therapy and have no moist, exudative or draining lesions at tournament time.
4. Gram stain of exudate from questionable lesions (if available).
5. **Active bacterial infections shall not be covered to allow participation. See above criteria when making decisions for participation status.**

Note: An antibiotic resistant form of Staphylococcus Aureus known as Methicillin-Resistant Staphylococcus Aureus (MRSA) is moving from acute care settings out into the community. Outbreaks have been documented in wrestling, football and fencing.

Tinea Infection

1. Letter from team physician to include: Clinical diagnosis, culture results (if available), names of antifungals used and dates of treatment.
2. A minimum of 3 days of topical therapy* is required for skin lesions. A minimum of two weeks of systemic antifungal therapy is required for scalp lesions.
3. Wrestlers with extensive and active lesions will be disqualified. Activity of treated lesions can be judged by examination of KOH prep AND review of therapeutic regimen. Wrestlers with solitary, or closely clustered, localized lesions will be disqualified if lesions are in a body location that cannot be securely covered. Covering routine should include selenium sulfide washing of lesion or ketoconazole shampoo (Nizoral), followed by application of naftifine gel or cream (Naftin) or Oxystat cream 1%, then gas permeable dressing such as Op-site or Bioclusive followed by ProWrap and stretch tape. Dressing changes should be done after each match so that the lesion can air dry.
4. The dispensation of tinea cases will be decided on an individual basis, as determined by the **Tournament Dermatologist and medical staff.**

Scabies

1. Letter from team physician describing and verifying appropriate treatment with scabicide.
2. Wrestler must have negative scabies prep at tournament time.

Molluscum Contagiosum

1. Lesions must be curetted or removed prior to tournament.
2. Wrestlers **should have verification about the removal and wound management provided regarding the viral warts.**

Herpes Zoster

1. Letter from team physician verifying and detailing drug therapy with an appropriate antiviral such as valacyclovir or famciclovir (Valtrex, Famvir) as well as dates of therapy.
2. Skin lesions must be surmounted by firm, adherent crust at tournament time, and have no evidence of secondary bacterial infection.

Pediculosis

Wrestler must be treated with appropriate pediculocide and re-examined for completeness of response before wrestling.

Verrucae

1. 1.Wrestlers with multiple digitate verrucae of their face will be disqualified if the infected areas cannot be covered with a mask. Solitary or scattered lesions can be curetted away prior to tournament.
2. Wrestler with multiple verrucae planae or verrucae vulgaris must have the lesions covered.

Hidradenitis Suppurativa

1. Wrestlers must provide letter to include culture and sensitivity results and dosage, dates and names of antibiotic therapy.
2. Wrestler will be disqualified if extensive, or purulent draining lesions are present.

COACH'S MEDICAL ATTESTATION FORM

1. I understand that members of my wrestling team will undergo a thorough skin exam to determine whether or not they have any infectious or potential infectious skin eruptions.
2. I understand that my wrestlers will need to be examined (1 week prior to tournament) and present proper verification (clinical diagnosis, culture results and date/dosage of systemic/topical medication) if warranted by a **knowledgeable physician** or dermatologist.
3. I understand that these forms are necessary and that any wrestler with a skin eruption who does not have a completed form may be possibly disqualified.
4. I understand that the decision of the skin exam is final and complete at the time of skin examination and that no exceptions will be made.
5. I understand that I may question the screening physician in a civilized manner at the proper time but that I will not be present during the skin exam or engage in any confrontational, abusive, or unacceptable behavior toward physicians or the screening committee. I understand that failure to do so may possibly result in disqualification of my wrestler and or myself with team penalty points sanctions as well.
6. I understand that any attempt on my part to encourage or aid in camouflaging potentially contagious skin rashes/eruptions may result in disqualification of my wrestler, myself as coach or team penalty points sanctions.

I have read and understand the tournament guidelines stated above by the National Prep Medical staff. Finally, I will abide by all of the rules and regulations regarding skin examinations as outlined above, and waive any liability for the National Prep Medical Staff toward the disposition of skin examinations.

WRESTLER/PARENT MEDICAL ATTESTATION FORM

I understand that contagious skin diseases are inherent to the sport of wrestling. These contagious diseases include herpes simplex (otherwise known as herpes gladiatorum), tinea gladiatorum (otherwise known as ringworm), infectious pyoderma (otherwise known as impetigo, folliculitis, boils, staph, etc.), and other infectious diseases, including an extensive viral eruption known as molluscum contagiosum.

I understand that these skin exams will involve a complete body, total undressed skin exam.

I understand that I will be examined (or my son/daughter will be examined) by a team of knowledgeable Physicians, expert Dermatologists, and knowledgeable Athletic Trainers and I accept the conditions of the skin exam outlined below:

1. Participants with skin rash/eruptions must present proper verification (clinical diagnosis, culture results, date/dosage of systemic/topical medications) to the tournament physicians. It is strongly recommended that this verification letter be completed by a knowledgeable dermatologist or physician regarding wrestling skin infections.
2. I, (or my parent) understand that the diagnosis and recommended treatment on the verification letter **does not** automatically qualify me for the tournament and that the possibility exists that the diagnosis and the treatment may be either incorrect, inadequate, or unacceptable.

I, (or my parent) understand that the decision as to whether or not my (or my son/daughter) skin lesion is infectious will be determined by the Tournament Medical staff and will be final and uncontestable.

3. Further, I (or my parent) understand that the purpose of the skin exams is not to diagnose skin lesions but to verify diagnoses and or treatment while confirming whether a rash is contagious. As a consequence, I understand that certain rashes cannot be definitively determined to be contagious or non-contagious during the skin exam will be considered potentially contagious and my son/daughter will be disqualified.

I (my son/daughter) understand that harassment or abuse toward the National Prep Medical staff by any coaches or wrestlers, etc., will not be tolerated and will possibly result in disqualification and penalties to the team.
